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II. Preface

This report presents International Merchandise Trade Statistics of The Gambia (IMTS) for first quarter 2023. It aims to show the outlook of trade between The Gambia and its trading partners during the period under review. It could also serve as a catalyst to enhance the investment drive of the country. The international merchandise trade statistics unit under the Directorate of Economic Statistics of the Gambia Bureau of Statistics (GBoS), receives monthly raw trade data extracted from the Customs and Exercise Department of the Gambia Revenue Authority (GRA) Database (ASYCUDAWORLD) in American Standard Code for Information Interchange (ASCII) format for processing using EUROTRACE¹.

Data cleaning is continuous as various tables are produced to feed into the reports. The database is therefore updated from time to time to take account of adjustments made from the input source.

The report contains a wide range of trade statistics between The Gambia and its partners. This avails data users with information to facilitate planning and decision making. Data can be provided to users based on the level of breakdown requested up to six (6) or eight (8) digits according to the Harmonized commodity description and coding system (HS).

The quarterly report contains data on the Trade Balance, Imports and Exports by major trading. The latest quarterly reports can be accessed on the Gambia Bureau of Statistics' website (<u>www.gbosdata.org</u>). For users who have specific data needs, the international merchandise trade statistics Unit could offer the necessary assistance.

The Gambia Bureau of Statistics wishes to express its profound gratitude to the ASYCUDAWORLD (Automated System Customs Data) Unit of The Gambia Revenue Authority (GRA), for making available the necessary data for the compilation of the International Merchandise Trade Statistics. We hope that users will find this report useful.

IV. Concepts and definitions

Monthly trade summary: Includes imports, exports and re-exports and total exports disaggregated by month.

Trade flow by selected continents and economic zones: Is the value of trade between The Gambia and selected geographic and economic zones.

Direction of trade: Trade flows from and to main trading partners. The ranking is done based on the highest ten by value in (GMD) and country.

Trade flow by top ten products: This indicates trade flows (import, exports, re-exports) by main products sorted based on the highest Cost Insurance and Freight (CIF) or Free on Board (FOB) value in (GMD'000) at 2-digit Harmonized System product code which groups related commodities.

Export trade: The exports of merchandise goods are valued at F.O.B and it refers to all movable goods. Share of domestic exports to total trade is the value of all goods exported to the rest of the world divided by total trade multiply by 100.

Import trade: The value of imported goods includes the cost, insurance, and freight (C.I.F). Share of imports to total trade is the value of all goods imported from the rest of the world divided by total trade multiply by 100.

Total Exports: This is the value of domestic exports plus re-exports.

V. Executive Summary

- The total value of imports in the first quarter of 2023 compared to the fourth quarter of 2022 declined from GMD13.49 billion to GMD11.4 billion.
- A total value of GMD11.4 billion of importation of goods was incurred during the first quarter of 2023 compared to the same period in 2022 of GMD10.9 billion. This Shows an increase of GMD0.5 billion over the period.
- First quarter 2022 shows larger importation of mineral fuel and vehicles compared to the same period in 2022.
- Oil seeds, fish products and animal or vegetables fats and oils were mostly exported in the first quarter of 2023.
- Senegal, Togo, and Cote d'Ivoire were the main import partners during the first quarter of 2023.

VI. Summary of Quarterly Trade Statistics 2022-2023

Table 1 below shows the quarterly trade statistics. The total value of imports in the first quarter of 2023 compared to the fourth quarter of 2022 declined from GMD13.49 billion to GMD11.4 billion. This indicates a drop in imports by 21.3 percentage points which is equivalent to GMD2.5 billion. However, the first quarter of 2022 compared to the first quarter of 2023, imports increased by 4.6 percent equivalent to GMD10.9 billion.

The value of total exports (i.e., domestic exports +re-exports) in the fourth quarter of 2022 increased from GMD 340.9 million to GMD518.4 in the same period of 2023. Whereas the value of total exports in the first quarter of 2022 decreased from GMD1.3 billion to GMD518.4 in first quarter 2023.

Furthermore, a similar trend is also observed in the trade balance between the first quarter of 2023 and the fourth quarter of 2022. The trade balance in the fourth quarter of 2022 decreased from GMD13.6 billion to GMD10.9 billion in the first quarter 2023. However, the trade balance between the first quarters of 2022 and 2023 increased from GMD9.6 billion to GMD10.9 billion.

VII. Imports by products

Import by Products

Figure 2 shows the top three products imported in the first quarter 2023 and 2022. The products imported are the same for both quarters. Of the overall imports the most imported product was mineral fuels. During the first quarter of 2022, 40.6 percent of this product was imported compared to 28.8 percent of the product in the same period in 2023. This was followed by importation of vehicles of 9.3 percent and 8.7 percent in the first quarters of 2022 and 2023 respectively. The third most imported products were cereals which shows that more of the product was imported during the first quarter of 2023 (8.5 %) compared to the first quarter of 2022 (8.2 %).

VIII. Exports by product

Exports of top three products from figure 3 shows that, the oil seeds, fish products and animal or vegetables fats and oils were mostly exported in the first quarter of 2023 and 2022. Animal or vegetable fats and oils (31.6 %) were the largest products exported in 2023, while oil seeds (55.2 %) were exported more in 2022.





IX. Imports of selected products for first quarter 2023

Imports of selected products for first quarter 2023 shows that the largest imported product was rice GMD (674.2 million), followed by cement GMD (467.7 million), vegetable oil GMD (385.4 million) and refine cane sugar GMD (240.4 million).

X. Trade by partners

The Gambia main import trade partners

Figure 5 below shows imports from partners for the first quarter of 2022 and 2023. The top three countries where most of the goods into the country were imported from during the first quarter of 2022: Senegal (13.0 %), China (12.9 %) and Turkey (7.5 %). During the first quarter, most of the imports were from cote d'Ivoire (40.4 %), Senegal (8.5 %), and China (6.5 %).

Table 3 below shows that China had the largest share of exports from The Gambia, however, its share decreased from 60.9 percent in the first quarter of 2022 to 55.0 percent in the same quarter of 2023. During the first quarter of 2022, the second largest partner of exports from The Gambia was to Vietnam (17.5 %) and for the same quarter in 2023, the second largest export partner was Turkey (9.8 %). The third partner of exports from the Gambia was Spain (3.4 %) and India (6.5 %) in 2022 and 2023 respectively.

XI. Intra Regional Trade (ECOWAS)

Figure 7 shows the imports from main ECOWAS partners in the first quarter of 2023. Senegal GMD (1.4 billion) had the highest import value, followed by Togo GMD (772.9 million) and Cote d'Ivoire GMD (509.0 million).
